works to increase Florida products served in schools, offer healthier options for Florida's children and get students involved in nutrition and agriculture education through school garden activities.



Florida districts purchased more than

\$6.9 MILLION

in Florida fruits and vegetables, representing more than

4 MILLION POUNDS

of Florida produce.

Schools spent approximately

on Florida fruits and vegetables through the USDA's Department of Defense Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program. More than
